The Water Sewer Authority of Cabarrus County keeps Cabarrus County safe by being the primary planning agent for water and sewer facilities. Just under 30 years ago, the towns and cities of the County of Cabarrus set up WSACC to operate and maintain a regional interceptor sewer system and wastewater treatment plant.
